

General Information

- **SUPERVISION:** All counselors are under the supervision of Bible Baptist Church and its staff. All campers are expected to submit to the authority of their counselors and ultimately, the Camp Director. Should there be disciplinary problems, parents may be called upon to pick up their child at their own expense.
- **SAFETY:** We are very serious about the safety of our campers on all fronts. Campers are nearly always within sight of 2 or more counselors. The camp facility and all campers are fully insured in the event of any medical expense. We do have medical-trained professionals as part of our camp staff, and all medications will be controlled and dispensed by a staff member.
- **WHAT TO BRING:** A Bible, bedding, personal toiletries, bath towels, refillable water bottle, and clothing.
- **DRESS CODE:** We believe God is honored when His people dress modestly. For this reason, shorts and sleeveless shirts are not allowed on either boy or girl campers. Girls are asked to wear skirts or full culottes, and to avoid low necklines and tight clothing. Appropriate water attire for the water day activities for all campers include dark t-shirts and shorts/culottes that come below the knee. We do not require campers to dress up for the services, so every day clothing will be sufficient for all activities.
- **WHAT NOT TO BRING:** Any electronic devices, pocketknives, candy & snacks, money. (We will ask campers to turn any money and electronics over to their counselors for safe-keeping during the week.)
- **MEALS:** Our kitchen staff works hard to provide well-balanced meals the entire week that are kid-friendly and appealing to everyone. They are experienced in cooking for special dietary allergies, so please let us know if your child has any needs in this way. **Please do not send snacks with your child.** The canteen is available twice a day for snacking, and this allows us to monitor how many snacks are being consumed between meals.
- **CANTEEN:** All canteen merchandise is purchased with a pre-paid canteen credit, indicated by you on the registration form. There is no exchange of money at the canteen, since campers are asked not to have any cash. The remaining balance of a camper's credit at the end of the week can be spent right before they leave the camp, reimbursed, or given as a camp offering. Most snacks are \$0.25-\$1.00 apiece, and most campers find that \$10 is sufficient for the week. (They are permitted to buy 3 snacks a day.) There is candy and 'junk food' available, but also a variety of healthy snacks like trail mix and granola bars.
- **LABELING:** Please take the time to label all possible items (including clothing, toiletries, Bible, bags) with your camper's name or initials in permanent marker. You would be amazed at the amount of stuff that belongs to no one at the end of camp, despite our best efforts to find the owner. Having things labeled helps us out tremendously.

Junior Camp Contests



Scripture Memorization: Each camper will be asked to recite the assigned verses to have a chance at winning the Scripture trophy: **Matthew 2:1-23, 4:12-25, 6:19-21, 16:13-17; Mark 2:1-12; Luke 24:44-48; John 1:1-5, 9-14, 4:5-26; 14:1-6; 2 Cor. 5:14-21; 1 John 3:4-6.** All verses MUST be recited in groups of three! A trophy will be awarded to the camper who has successfully quoted without error the most Bible verses throughout the week. Start memorizing your verses BEFORE coming to camp.



Talent Contest: Each camper is encouraged to come fully prepared to participate in our annual talent contest! You may compete in two categories: Serious or Humorous. Various entries to be considered are: vocal and instrumental presentations, solo, duet, trio, etc., recitations, skits, or any other kind of performance that would illustrate talent among the campers. All entries MUST be organized and rehearsed BEFORE coming to camp. Prizes will be awarded for each category.

A REMINDER!

All serious entries in the talent contest must have a practical application for Christian service. All humorous entries STILL ought to display "a talent" and must be in good taste, without being inappropriate. If two entries are submitted, they cannot be under the same category, i.e. one entry must be humorous, and the other entry must be serious. Please notice our registration form for entering the talent contest.

Poster Contest: Every camper is encouraged to enter the poster contest under the official rules.

1. Your poster must be your own, original artwork prepared on a standard sized poster-board. You may receive suggestions and minimal help from your parent or teacher.
2. **"Discovering the Rock of Ages"** must be the theme of your poster.
3. You may use crayons, paints, markers, colored pencils, or any other mediums for your work. BE CREATIVE!
4. Posters are to be submitted during camp registration.
5. All entries will be judged according to creativity, color, neatness, originality, and artistic ability.
