Cabins are furnished with different sizes of beds, but you are responsible to bring your own bedding & towels. If you do reserve a cabin, we will put you in one that is the appropriate size for your family, and let you know the sizes of the beds (queen, double, twin). Some cabins come with AC, but you may want to bring your own fan. Also, bring a jacket as the nights can be cool. Many campers also like to bring seat pads for the old, hard pews in the pavilion.

We believe God is honored when His people dress modestly. For this reason, shorts and sleeveless, "tank top" type shirts are not allowed on either men or women. Women & girls are asked to wear feminine apparel, in the form of skirts, dresses, or full culottes, rather than pants or jeans. Please avoid low necklines and tight, immodest clothing.
