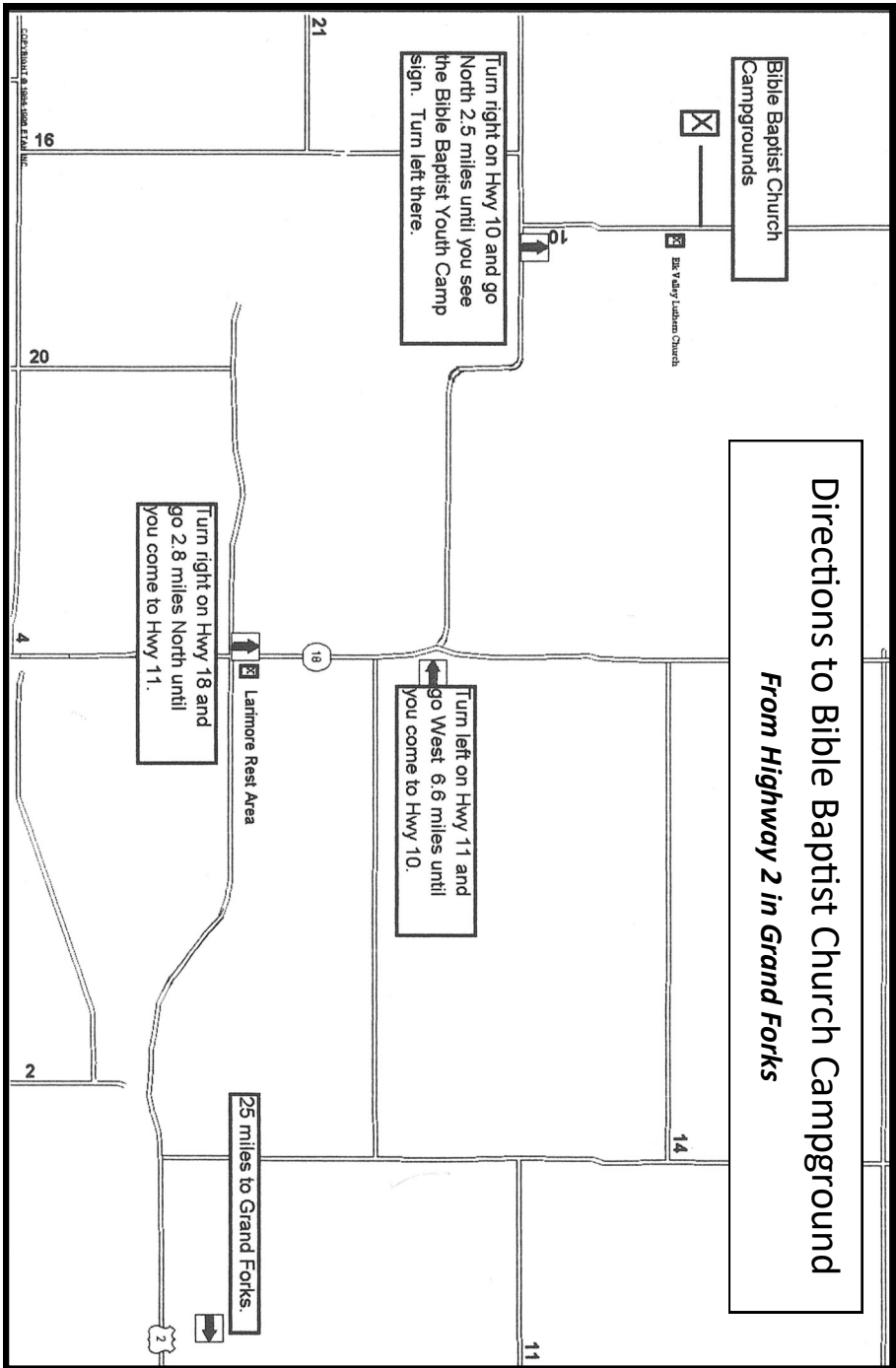

## **REGISTRATION OPENS APRIL 13TH @ NOON**

**Cabins will be given out on a first-come, first-served basis.**

**You can ‘reserve’ a cabin by calling or emailing the church office, or registering online, NO SOONER than April 13th at noon!**

**Registration deadline is June 29; please register even if you are just eating meals and not staying overnight.**

**This will allow the cooks an accurate head count for purchasing food.**

## *Camp Details*

1. The special camp speaker this year is Evangelist Tom Smith, former Pastor of Mt. Zion Baptist Church in St. Claire, MO. He will be preaching in some of the evening services, as well as some of the daytime services. Pastor Mike Custer and some other preachers in attendance at camp will fill in the other preaching “slots.”



2. Nursery from 2 years of age and down will be provided at each service. Children’s Church will be provided during the morning sessions for age 2 up through 4th grade.
3. If you would like to stay in a cabin, be sure to register early! Cabins fill up quickly, as do camper/RV hookups. In the past couple years, all cabins have been claimed within a few hours of registration opening up, and last year all camper hookups were full as well. Don’t delay to reserve your spot, but do remember that there is ample room for tenting if you are unable to get your first choice.
4. Cabins are furnished with different sizes of beds, but you are responsible to bring your own bedding & towels. If you do reserve a cabin, we will put you in one that is the appropriate size for your family, and let you know the sizes of the beds (queen, double, twin). Some cabins come with AC, but you may want to bring your own fan. Also, bring a jacket as the nights can be cool. Many campers also like to bring seat pads.
5. We believe God is honored when His people dress modestly. For this reason, shorts and sleeve-



less, “tank top” type shirts are not allowed on either men or women. Women & girls are asked to wear feminine apparel, in the form of skirts, dresses, or full culottes, rather than pants or jeans. Please avoid low necklines and tight, immodest clothing.

6. All facilities are open to campers, except private cabin areas, canteen, and kitchen. Kitchen facilities are kept sanitary for camp meal preparation, and are not open for general use.

(There is one refrigerator that may have available space for baby food & milk, should you need to bring that.)

7. We have a canteen for snacks (run by the BBC teens) that is open twice a day. The money the teens earn goes toward their teen camp expenses later in the summer.
8. We always need help with washing dishes, cleaning up the dining hall & washrooms, and watching the little ones in the nursery. We will welcome volunteers in these areas.
9. There will be ample time in the afternoons for activities, so feel free to bring sporting equipment or games. Campfires within the fire rings are permitted; no fireworks and no pets.
10. Please remember to drive up to the camp SLOWLY—maximum speed 15 mph—to keep from stirring up too much dust for our neighbors.
