GENERAL INFORMATION



Counselors: All counselors are under the supervision of Bible Baptist Church and its staff. All campers are expected to submit to the authority of their counselors and ultimately, the Camp Director. Should there be disciplinary problems, parents may be called upon to pick up their child at their own expense.

<u>Counseling</u>: We have spiritually mature, experienced counselors on hand to answer the campers' questions about spiritual issues, including salvation. We take this responsibility very seriously, and are very careful in how we deal with children.

Safety: We are very conscientious about the safety of our campers. Campers are nearly always within sight of 2 or more counselors. The camp facility and all campers are fully insured in the event of any medical incident. We do have medically-trained professionals as part of our camp staff, and all medications will be controlled and dispensed by a staff member.

<u>Items to Bring:</u> A Bible, a bedroll, personal toiletries, bath towels, refillable water bottle, and clothing.


Items NOT to Bring: Any electronic devices, pocketknives, candy & snacks, money. (We will ask campers to turn any money and electronics over to their counselors for safe-leeping during the week.

<u>Dress Code</u>: We believe God is honored when His people dress modestly. For this reason, shorts and sleeveless shirts are not allowed on either boy or girl campers. Girls are asked to wear knee-length skirts or culottes, and to avoid low necklines and tight clothing. Appropriate water attire for the water day activities for all campers include dark t-shirts and knee-length shorts/culottes. We do not require campers to dress up for the evening preaching services, so everyday clothing will be sufficient for all activities.

<u>Camp Meals:</u> Our kitchen staff works hard to provide well-balanced meals the entire week that are kid-friendly and appealing to everyone. They are experienced in cooking for special dietary allergies, so please let us know if your child has any needs in this way. Please do not send snacks with your child. The canteen is available twice a day for snacking, and this allows us to monitor how many snacks are being consumed between meals.

<u>Canteen:</u> All canteen merchandise is purchased with a pre-paid canteen credit, indicated by you on the registration form. There is no exchange of money at the canteen, since campers are asked to not have any cash. The remaining balance of a camper's credit at the end of the week can be spent right before they leave the camp, reimbursed, or given as a camp offering. Most snacks are \$0.25-\$1.00 apiece, and most campers find that \$10 is sufficient for the week. There is candy and junk food available, but also a variety of healthy snacks like trail mix and granola bars.

***Parents, please have all of your child's toiletries, clothing items, and personal belongings (including his/her Bible), LABELED with a permanent marker! EVERY YEAR we have piles of clothing items and miscellaneous "things" that go unclaimed!
